UniMarconi was the first university in Italy to recognize the potential use of technology in the academic field and, over the years, has developed a digital education model based on innovation, teaching quality, and student-centeredness.

Marconi AI Tutor *Artificial Intelligence Supporting Learning*

Marconi AI Tutor is the new study support system developed by UniMarconi in collaboration with Almawave, a company of the Al maviva Group specialized in Artificial Intelligence and natural language technologies.

The system is designed to support students through tools built exclusively on the official educational content of UniMarconi courses, ensuring reliability of sources, consistency with the academic pathway, and full alignment with educational activities.

Marconi AI Tutor allows students to consult educational materials, receive personalized explanations and summaries, complete self-assessment tests, and quickly identify relevant content even within video and audio lectures.

The project is part of the University's educational innovation pathway and will be progressively developed according to an approach focused on quality, personalized learning, and continuous improvement.

The service was introduced experimentally through a pilot phase involving a selected number of degree programs, with the goal of providing students with innovative support while also gathering useful evidence for continuous improvement.

PhD in Physical and Engineering Sciences for Innovation and Sustainability

The **PhD in Physical and Engineering Sciences for Innovation and Sustainability** is an advanced research training program aimed at developing high-level competencies in scientific and technological research, with particular attention to the challenges of technological innovation and socio-economic and environmental sustainability.

The PhD prepares researchers and professionals capable of playing a leading role in innovation processes for industry and society, contributing to the advancement of new knowledge, managing original research and development projects, and independently carrying out strategically important programs that address the needs and challenges of an ever-evolving context.

PhD in Legal and Political Sciences

The **PhD in Legal and Political Sciences** offers highly qualified training that—while respecting the autonomy of the various legal, political, and economic disciplines, their historical traditions, and the analytical and research methods specific to each field—aims to educate doctoral researchers with strong methodological foundations, multidisciplinary knowledge, and an international outlook. This is further supported by opportunities to establish co-supervision agreements, obtain the Doctor Europaeus certificate, and participate in mobility and training programs at other European and international universities and research institutions.

PhD in Human Sciences

The **PhD in Human Sciences** is designed to provide advanced training that enables candidates to acquire research knowledge and skills in disciplines focused on the study of human beings from psychological, linguistic, philosophical, historical, sociological, and educational perspectives.

More specifically, the psychological component of the training program focuses on research topics in general psychology, psychobiology and physiological psychology, dynamic psychology, and clinical psychology. In the field of linguistics, the program addresses areas of interest in glottology and linguistics, including studies related to the teaching of modern languages.

The historical and philosophical component of the program is particularly concerned with medieval history, theoretical philosophy, aesthetics, and the philosophy of language. Finally, in the socio-pedagogical area, the program encompasses studies in the sociology of law, deviance, and social change. It also addresses teaching methods, special education, and educational research, with particular emphasis on topics relevant to experimental pedagogy.

School of Specialization for Legal Professions

In the academic year 2008/2009, the School of Specialization for Legal Professions (SSPL) was established within the Department of Economic, Business, Legal, and Political Sciences of UniMarconi following the entry into force of Ministerial Decree no. 537 of December 21, 1999.

The SSPL aims to promote and develop the body of knowledge and skills constituting the professional expertise required of ordinary magistrates, lawyers, and notaries, enriched through the analysis of practical cases specific to each of the three professional profiles.

Participation in the School and the attainment of the related Diploma constitute a mandatory requirement for participation in the judicial clerkship examination for graduates enrolled in the Law Degree Program starting from the 1998/1999 academic year.

The attainment of the diploma is also recognized for the completion of the practical training period required for participation in the State examination for notarial and legal practice, for a period of one year.

For newly graduated aspiring magistrates, the specialization diploma has effectively become an essential qualification for participation in the related public examination.

Preparatory Course for the Judiciary Examination

UniMarconi promotes a preparatory course for the Judiciary Examination intended for Law graduates interested in pursuing a career in the ordinary judiciary.

The course is designed to provide advanced and systematic preparation in the main subjects covered by the competitive examinations, through an approach focused on theoretical in-depth study, jurisprudential analysis, and the development of argumentative and drafting skills.

The educational pathway is intended to support candidates in developing study methods, legal writing techniques, and the ability to approach competitive examinations with a structured and informed methodology.

Microcredentials

UniMarconi is the first Italian digital university to introduce **microcredentials** developed according to **European standards**.

These are short, flexible, and certified learning pathways designed to develop specific, up-to-date, and immediately applicable skills in professional or academic contexts.

Each microcredential is certified through the issuance of a digital Open Badge, which transparently and recognizably certifies the acquired competencies.

Microcredentials represent a concrete opportunity for students, professionals, and individuals undergoing career transitions, offering accessible, recognized education oriented toward the labor market.

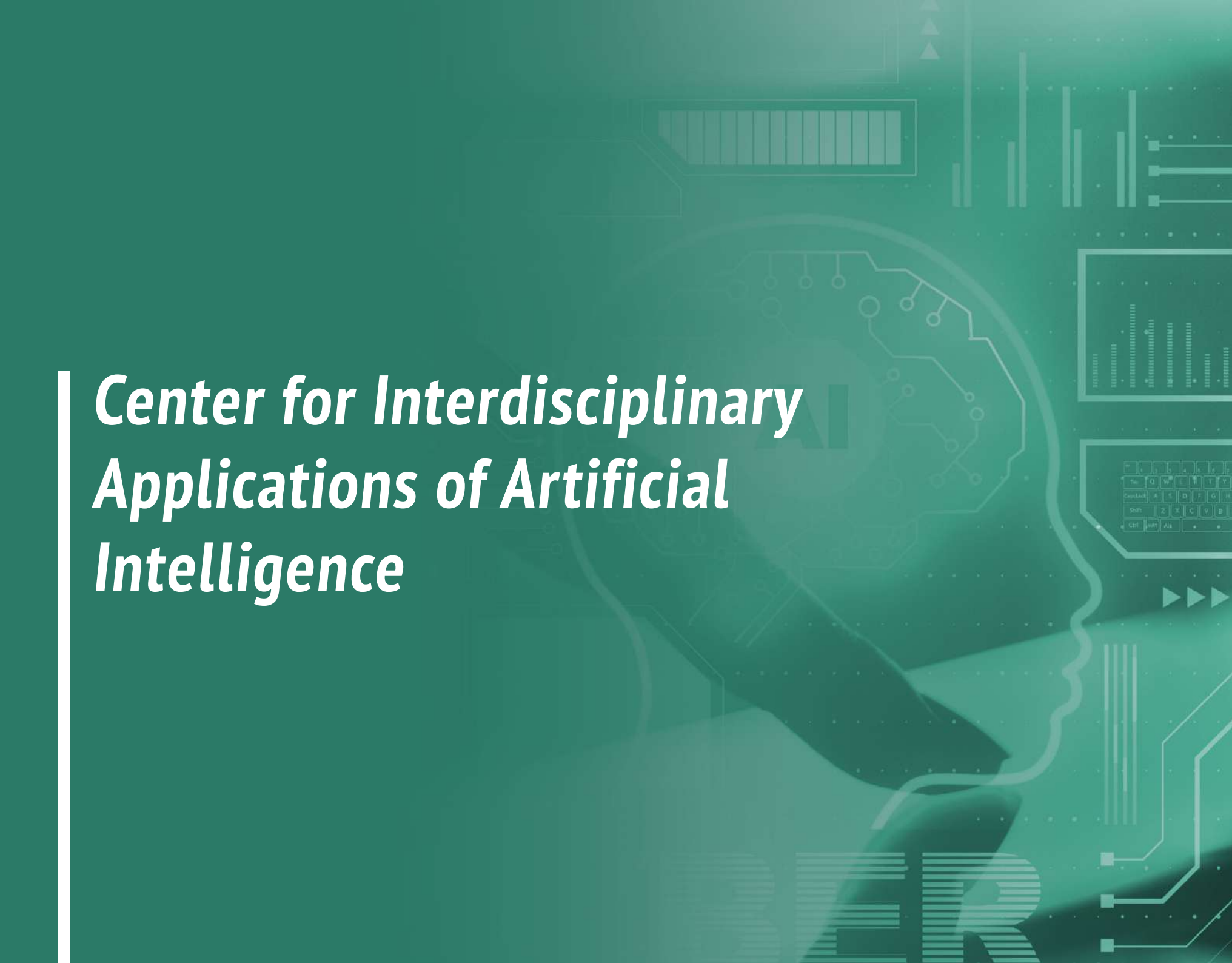
Foundation Course

The Foundation Course is a preparatory program taught in English and officially recognized by the Italian State, designed for international students who do not meet the minimum academic requirements for admission to degree programs at Italian universities.

The pathway is designed to bridge the gap between the student's previous educational system and university education by providing adequate preparation both academically and linguistically.

The program is intended for:

- Students holding a secondary school diploma obtained after 11 years of education, who need to complete an additional year to meet the required 12 years of schooling;
- Students who, despite having completed 12 years of education, wish to strengthen their academic and language skills before entering university.



Center for Interdisciplinary Applications of Artificial Intelligence

The Center brings together expertise from engineering, artificial intelligence, sports sciences, psychology, and pedagogy with the goal of developing models, methodologies, and technologies capable of connecting scientific innovation and human impact, enhancing the interaction between technological, cognitive, educational, and behavioral dimensions.

Engineering and artificial intelligence constitute the technological infrastructure of the project through the development of AIoT architectures, edge-fog-cloud systems, data acquisition and processing platforms, and hardware/software integration processes. Psychological, pedagogical, and motor sciences instead contribute to the definition of interpretative models, observation protocols, and applied methodologies, directing the use of technologies toward concrete objectives related to well-being, cognitive development, learning, and human performance.

The experimental phase currently underway is focused on athlete well-being and the multidimensional analysis of human performance.

The methodologies and technologies developed will progressively be extended to educational, psychological, and pedagogical contexts, with the goal of promoting innovative models supporting well-being, learning, and personal development.

The scientific governance of the Center is entrusted to a Scientific Committee composed of representatives from the following areas:

- Artificial Intelligence
- Engineering
- Sports Sciences
- Psychology
- Pedagogy

The executive management of activities is entrusted to an Operational Committee.

University Laboratories

To strengthen its role in promoting sustainable development, technological innovation, and advanced teaching, UniMarconi has developed two dedicated infrastructures: the Sustainable Technology Laboratory (STL) and the Student Lab (SL), coordinated by Prof. Enrico Bocci of the Department of Engineering Sciences.

Sustainable Technology Laboratory (STL)

It contributes to the ecological and energy transition through:

- development of technologies for environmental sustainability
- technology transfer through projects with companies and patents
- enhancement of public engagement and UniMarconi's educational offer

Student Lab (SL)

The Student Lab supports the integration of advanced teaching methodologies into academic programs through experimental activities, simulations, project work, and applied learning.

Virtual Laboratories

Research & Innovation

UniMarconi combines teaching with intensive research activity, promoting national and international projects focused on innovation, sustainability, and scientific development.

Research represents a strategic dimension of the University and is developed through Departments, Doctoral Programs, research groups, and collaborations with national and international institutions, organizations, and scientific networks.

Research and Development Area

The Research and Development Area supports Departments in the formulation and implementation of nationally and European-funded projects, participating in programs such as Horizon Europe, Erasmus+, LIFE, Interreg, and the PNRR.

The University also develops activities in:

Research Projects

UniMarconi participates in numerous national and European research projects in the fields of energy, sustainability, technological innovation, and human and social sciences.

Among these is the ASEX project – “Understanding sexuality through asexuality”, dedicated to the study of asexuality, sexual health, and epistemic justice through interdisciplinary qualitative and quantitative research methodologies.

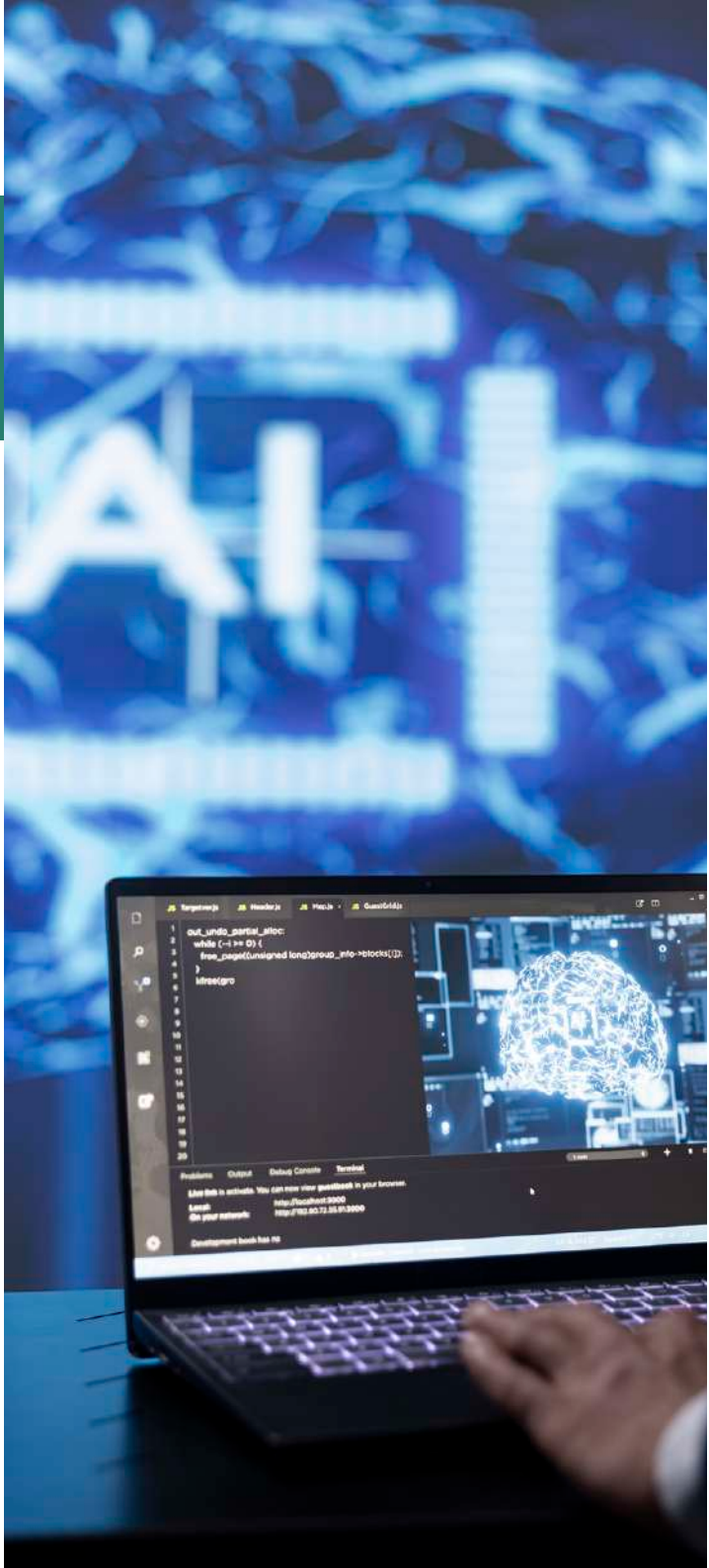
UniMarconi’s Third Mission is developed through:

The Observatory brings together academic experts, institutional representatives, and leading companies, establishing itself as a reference point for the dissemination of an ethical, sustainable, and human-centered artificial intelligence.

A University Open to the World

Internationalization represents a strategic dimension of UniMarconi's development and is expressed through academic cooperation activities, international mobility, shared research, and the promotion of Italian culture worldwide.

Thanks to a digital, flexible, and accessible learning model, UniMarconi is developing a growing network of collaborations with universities, organizations, and institutions across Europe, Africa, Asia, and Latin America, promoting educational pathways and projects focused on intercultural dialogue and innovation.

The University's international offer includes:

- courses and programs taught in English
- international postgraduate programs
- Foundation Course

In 2026, the Center for World University Rankings included UniMarconi among the top 2,000 universities worldwide, making it the only Italian online university present in the CWUR 2026 international ranking.

A Growing International Network

UniMarconi's international strategy is developed through agreements and partnerships focused on:

- international mobility
- shared research
- double degrees and co-supervised PhDs
- spread of Italian language and culture
- development of international educational and scientific projects

A Global Network of Relations and Opportunities

UniMarconi's international strategy is structured around five key regions:

- Africa, where the University promotes institutional partnerships aligned with the Mattei Plan and the European Union's Global Gateway strategy
- Europe and the Mediterranean area, with double degree agreements, PhD co-supervision, and collaborations with universities and research centers
- Middle East, particularly Dubai, a rapidly growing educational and cultural hub
- Southeast Asia, with excellence projects in several countries including Singapore
- Latin America, with initiatives dedicated to the promotion of Italian language and culture

Certification Commission



The Certification Commission was established at UniMarconi by Ministerial Decree of the Italian Ministry of Labor and Social Policies dated June 6, 2017.

The Commission is chaired by Prof. Vincenzo Valentini, Associate Professor of Labor Law at the Department of Economic, Business, Legal, and Political Sciences of the University.

What is Certification?

The certification of employment contracts, introduced by Legislative Decree No. 276 of 2003 (the so-called “Biagi Reform”), is a voluntary and joint procedure through which the contracting parties may request and obtain from a specific Commission a certification confirming that the employment contract they intend to sign, or have already signed, complies with the legal requirements of form and content.

Benefits and Opportunities

The two main advantages of certification can be summarized as follows:

- the legitimacy of the contract classification, as the Certification Commission actively supports the parties in drafting the contract and verifies and validates compliance with legal requirements of form and content
- the binding nature of the contract, as the certified classification is also effective toward third parties (INPS, INAIL, Tax Authorities, Ministry of Labor) and remains valid until a court ruling, serving as a tool that substantially reduces legal disputes



Research & Development Tax Credit Certification Commission

UniMarconi is authorized by the Italian Ministry of Enterprises and Made in Italy to issue certifications for companies investing in research, technological innovation, and development activities.

Through a Commission composed of faculty members and experts, the University evaluates corporate projects to verify compliance with the requirements established by law in order to access tax incentives in the form of tax credits.

This service represents a concrete link between university, research, and the business world, enhancing the University's scientific expertise in support of innovation and technological development.

University Campuses

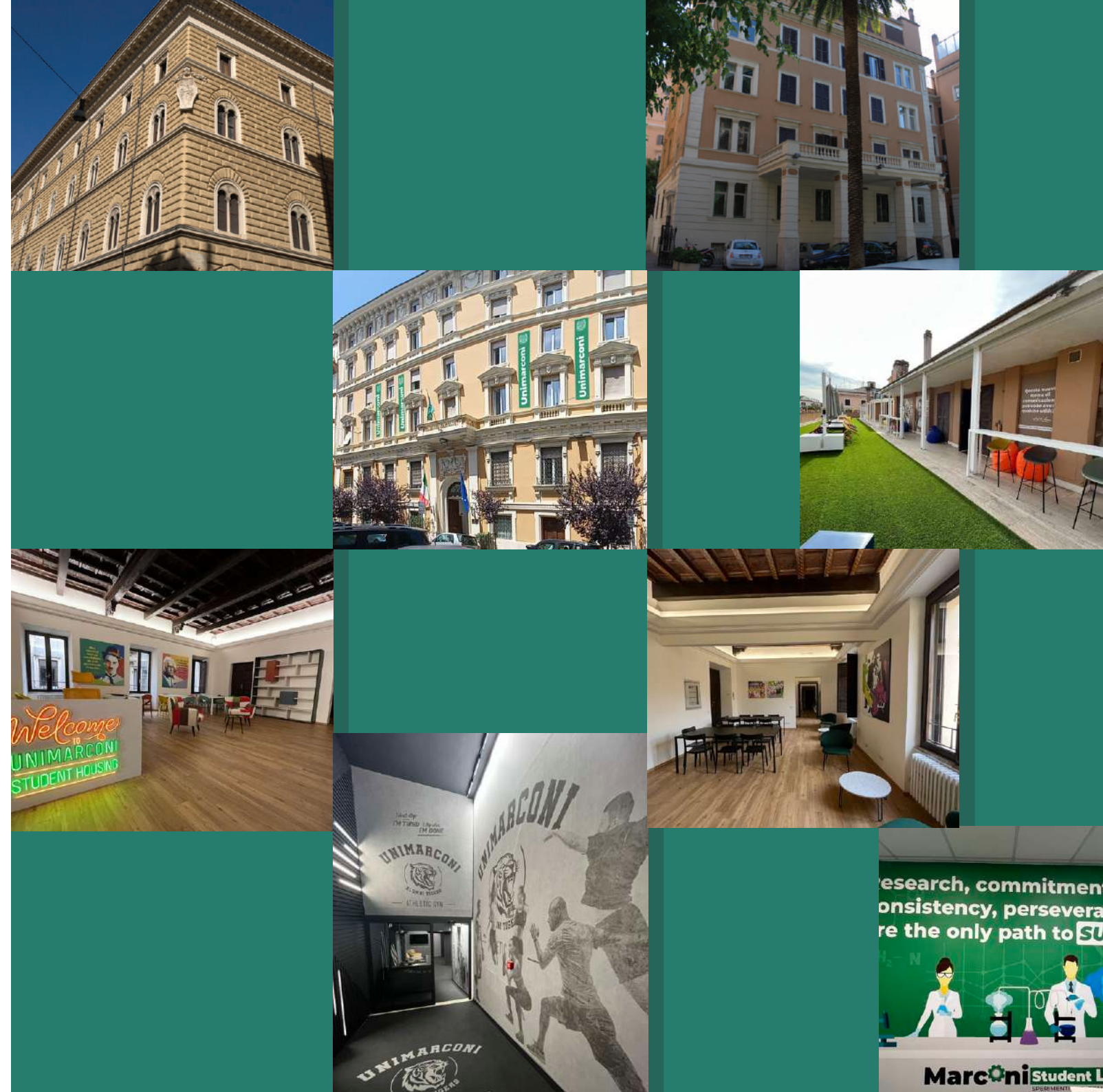
UniMarconi has modern and functional campuses located in the Prati district of Rome, designed to support teaching activities, research, institutional events, and services dedicated to the academic community.

The campuses in Via Plinio, Via Paolo Emilio, Via Vittoria Colonna, and Via Crescenzo host classrooms of various sizes equipped with multimedia systems and technologies for teaching and streaming, halls dedicated to conferences and institutional events, spaces for individual and collaborative study, outdoor areas, and an international student residence in the heart of Rome.

Among the representative spaces, the Aula Magna located in the historic Palazzo Simonetti-Odescalchi stands out, used for academic and institutional events, as well as the Giulio Cesare Hall and the Plinio Hall, equipped with professional audio-video systems and tools for hybrid teaching and live streaming.

The University also provides spaces dedicated to the student community, designed to encourage study, participation, and shared university life, in line with a model focused on educational quality and student well-being.

Special attention is also given to internationalization, through a modern and functional student residence designed to host international students in a central, dynamic environment integrated into the academic life of the city.

The University's digital model also introduces a distinctive environmental benefit, contributing to the reduction of impacts related to travel and traditional university teaching processes.

Dynamic CO₂ Emissions Counter

As part of the University Sustainability Project, UniMarconi has developed a dynamic monitoring system for CO₂ emissions avoided thanks to digital teaching.

Through dedicated software, the counter updates in real time on the University's website the cumulative emissions savings generated by reduced mobility and the online delivery of courses, providing a continuous measurement of the positive environmental impact of the digital university model.

The University is also a member of RUS – Network of Universities for Sustainable Development – and integrates ESG principles into its development and innovation processes.
